Marketings of moderate proportions and well distributed over trading period Upturns in live prices solidly supported by higher trend early on carcass beef at wholesale level. Trading fairly active despite non-slaughter holiday in some plants Monday and most buying interests competed aggressively for numbers, although late demand narrowed somewhat, and ratio between current live prices and carcass realizations generally not considered favorable. Overall finish fairly attractive with liberal percentage choice and moderate
