



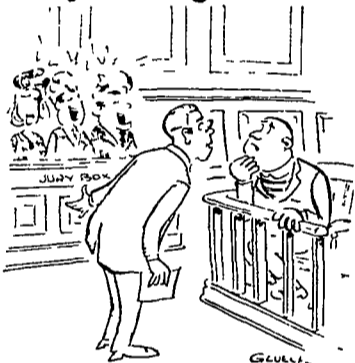

The society will entertain their husbands at the 20th Anniversary party at 6:30 p.m. Nov. 13 at Meadow Hills.

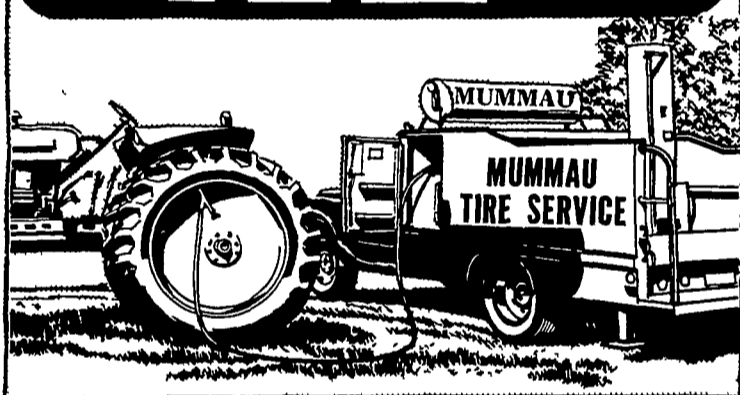
Guests of Conestoga View will be entertained by the Society on Nov. 18.

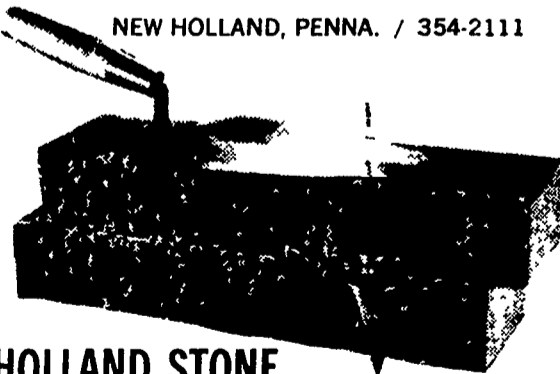

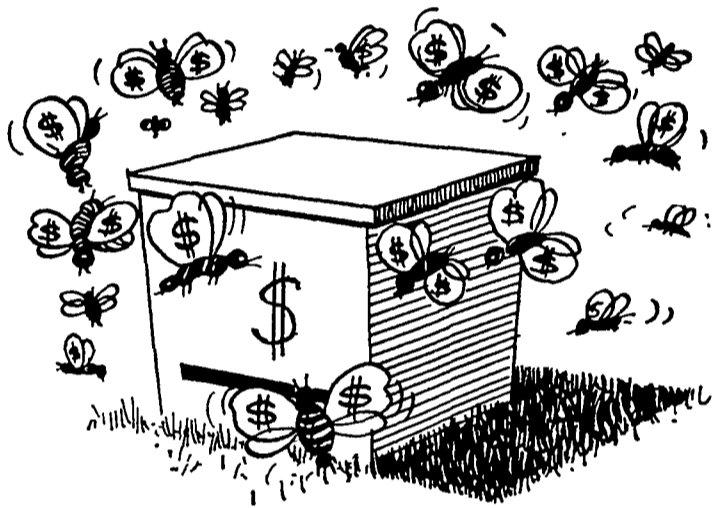
