Several local farmers and farm youth were among those honored last week at the Pennsylvania Holstein Association annual convention in Altoona.

The herd of Clarence Stauter, Ephrata, was among five herds recognized for high classification average and body conformation.

Receiving recognition for leading lactation averages for production achievements were: J. Mowery Frey Jr, Lancaster, Sinking Springs Farms, Inc., York, and Paul B Zimmerman, Ephrata

Recognized for receiving All-American honors for show ring winnings during the 1970 season were: J. Mowery Frey Jr, Lancaster, George M. Knight Jr, Airville; Hubert S. Miller, Myerstown, and Raymond A. Seidel, Richland.

The Lancaster County Holstein Breeders Association received a membership service award for having the most new members.

The Lancaster County Association was also recognized

for a sale and show achievements award for having the winning club herd at the State Black and White Show York County was recognized for having the highest averaging county consignment at the State Calf Sale last spring

Jefferson D. Yoder, Elverson, was recognized for receiving the National Holstein Association's most sought after award, the Progressive Breeders Registry Award

Receiving All-Pennsylvania awards were: John Mowery Frey, Lancaster, for junior yearling heifer, Fultonway Rachel Amy Jane; George Knight Jr, Airville, for senior yearling heifer, Remcrest KP Lola; Herbert and Rhelda Royer, Lancaster, five year old and over cow, Blossomelle Dairy Princess, and Andrew Stoltzfus, Elverson, for best three females.

Junior Contest

Pennsylvania 4-H and FFA members entered 44 Registered Holsteins in the 10th annual Junior Holstein Milk and Fat

Production Contest All production records entered were 305 days in length and included only the last lactation completed in the DHIA testing year which ended September 30. Winners included:

Gary L. Akers, Quarryville, who was third in milk production in the two year and under three year class with 19,755 pounds of milk from Solanco-Acres Van Ringer Trixie

Michael R Stewart, Airville, York County, was third in butterfat production with 722 pounds of butterfat in the two year and under three year class with Jackie Stewhills Streak

In the three year and under four year class, P. Carl Yoder, Elverson, Chester County, was second in milk production with 21,947 pounds of milk from his Rocky-Side Star June.

Three Chester County animals placing high in the four year old and over class were: Joyce F Weaver, Glenmoore, second in milk and third in butterfat with 24,270 pounds of milk and 872 pounds of butterfat from Welsh Springs Golden Violet, Carol Yoder Elverson, third in milk with 23,840 pounds from Rocky Side Beauty, and Susan J. Weaver, Glenmoore, fifth in butterfat with 771 pounds, from Marsh Acres Piney Empress.

In his President's Address, George Bridenbaugh reported fiscal year achievements of a record high State Membership of 4,905, putting Pennsylvania first in the nation.

Also, Pennsylvania firsts on the national level include Holstein registrations at 48,822, transfers at 26,386, and active national members at 4,715

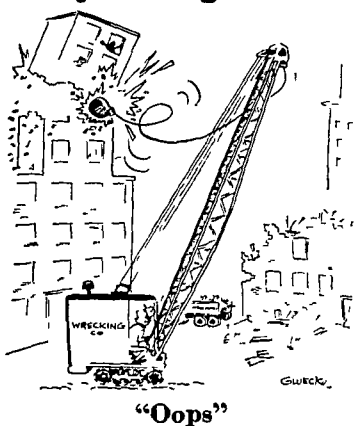
Pennsylvania All-American Invitational Sale set a record average of \$3,152 an 41 consignments with a top of \$41,000, the recognition of 15 Pennsylvania Holsteins in the 1970 All-American Contest, Nineteen District Black and White Shows with 2,802 exhibits plus a record attendance of 547 participants at the four Association-sponsored Judging Schools

Presenting staff reports were Secretary William C. Nichol and Holstein-Friesian Association Program Directors Loren Engelbrecht and Carl Brown. In their remarks they stressed the

need for more involvement of the total membership in Association programs, the need for expansion of youth programs, plus the importance of developing a market for Pennsylvania Registered Holsteins in foreign countries

Nearly 600 dairymen from across the State participated in the two-day program. Next year's convention will be held in 11-county Southeast District of the Pennsylvania Holstein Association. Serving this year as General Convention Chairman was G. Milton Corle, Martinsburg

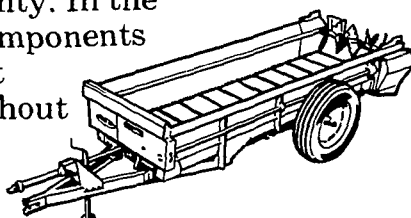

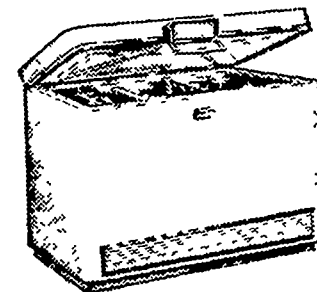
