His farming program consists of 20 fattening hogs, one beef fattening animal and has five dairy animals.

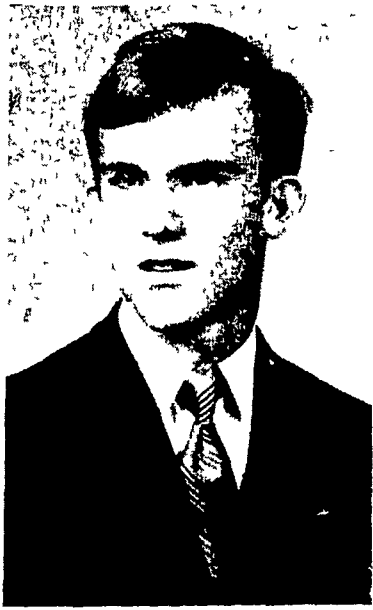

serving as president of the local Chapter this year.

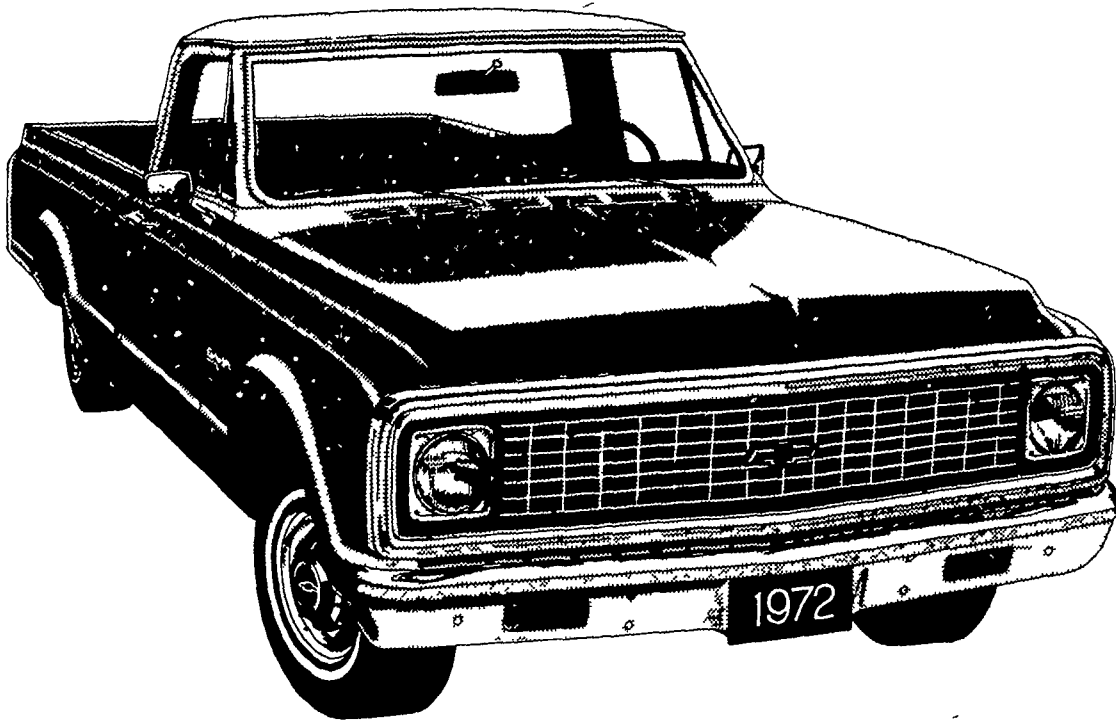
For two years Dennis went to the State FFA Convention at Penn State University, and also went to the National FFA Convention in Kansas City.
