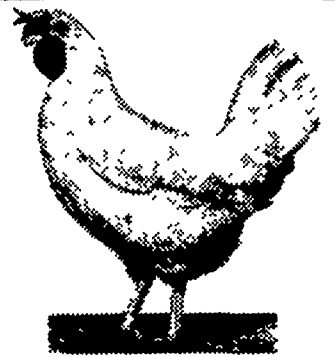
## New York Eggs

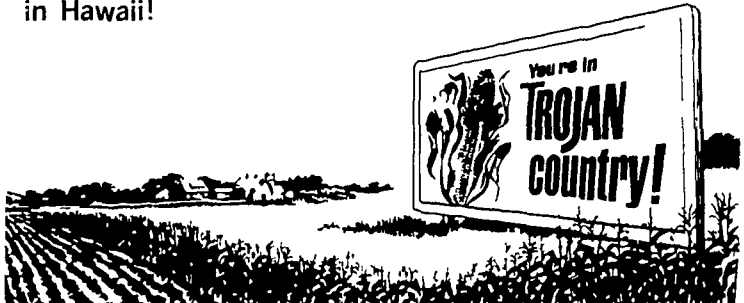
