Three More Rabies Cases

Two cattle farms in Tioga County have reported that three of their animals have been lost to rabies, according to a report from the Bureau of Animal Industry of the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture.

On a feeder and breeding operation near Middlebury Center, a mature cow and a heifer were diagnosed positive to rabies tests. There are about 60 animals on this farm.

About 15 miles due west on the Tioga-Potter County line, one cow in a herd of 80 was diagnosed positive.

Because there is no knowledge of any possible bites or contact with predators on the affected animals, no link has been established between the two outbreaks.

The rabid cattle were destroyed and all other cattle on the two farms will be quarantined for a period of at least 100 days.

The three cases brings the total to 18 since the start of this fiscal year. Last year at this same date the total was only eight.

Feed-Grain

Dates Changed

Producer sign-up for participation in the 1972 wheat, feed grain and cotton programs today was changed to the period February 3 through March 10 by the U S Department of Agriculture. Originally the sign-up was scheduled January 17 through February 25.

USDA officials said the change in time of sign-up is being made to permit producers and the Department to evaluate information from a special January 27 Farmers Planting Intentions Report.

However, County ASCS offices can accept signups from producers prior to the beginning of the official sign-up period, subject to the rules and regulations in effect on February 3, 1972.

The February 3 starting date for 1972 sign-up compares to March 1 for the 1971 programs, and a range of February 2 to February 6 for the four preceding program years.

255-Pound Squash
