Resolutions Adopted

The following resolutions were adopted:

(1) WHEREAS, There is legislation pending that would prohibit the sale of drugs through the mail. And

RESOLVED, That Lancaster County Pomona Grange 71 goes on record favoring an amendment to said legislation that would allow the continuance of this service by the National Grange and any other responsible organization

(2) WHEREAS, Every 10 years the General Assembly is mandated by law to reapportion according to the last census the

membership of the Congress from Pennsylvania

WHEREAS, Pennsylvania will lose two Congressmen this year because the population decreased during the last 10 years.

WHEREAS, There is a bill before the General Assembly which puts the member of Lancaster County into the same district with the member from part of Chester County which means that one will be eliminated at the spring Primary Election.

The method supported by most of the members of Congress takes one member from Philadelphia and one from Pittsburgh because they both lost population during the last 10 years Therefore be it

RESOLVED, That we ask our Senators and Representatives from Lancaster County to vote against any bill which puts Lancaster and Chester Counties into one district, but to be for any bill which takes one member from Philadelphia and one from Pittsburgh

(3) WHEREAS, The leaders of the Republican Party in Lancaster County in order to keep peace in their ranks and give another member a chance to be County Commissioner, created a new position of County Administrator at a cost of \$15,000 to the taxpayers And

WHEREAS, We feel the position of County Administrator

is unnecessary and a waste of taxpayers money. Be it

RESOLVED, That Lancaster County Pomona Grange, meeting in regular session, condemn the action and ask that the position be abolished
