Jugger Conference Set

A conference for farm milk juggers will be held in Borland Laboratory at Pennsylvania State University on February 8-10, 1972. The program will start Tuesday noon and end Thursday noon. Forty-three persons participated in the 1971 conference, reports County Agent Max Smith.

This year's conference is planned for processing and sales personnel. Topics covered will include processing procedures, flavor and quality control, cleaning and sanitizing, sanitation regulations and selling. Pre-registration is

required prior to January 28, 1972, says Smith.

Participation is limited to 40 persons, but unless at least 15 are pre-registered, it will be canceled. The fee is \$20.
