Consumers Want to Know

I'd like to replace an electric hotplate which I've used many years but have discovered they aren't made any more. Why do manufacturers discontinue useful items such as this?

Hot plates are still manufactured and are increasingly popular. Today they are called different names such as buffet range, portable electric range or table range. These are one-burner and two-burner models; the single burners use 1000 to 1100 watts and some even offer variable temperature settings. On double-burner models there is usually one burner using 500 watts, the other 1000 to 1100 watts. Look for these ranges in housewares departments, some electric utilities, hardware stores, mail order catalogs, and trading stamp redeeming centers.

Does a 4-slice toaster require special wiring to operate efficiently?

The wattage of a 4-slice toaster varies from 1500 to 1650 watts, which is considerably more than a 2-slice model requires. In many homes the normal circuit will not accept more than 1660 watts. In such cases a 4-slice toaster should not be used on the same circuit with a refrigerator.

The use and care book accompanying my refrigerator advises unplugging the cord from the electrical outlet when cleaning or changing a light bulb. Turning the control to "off" is easier—why isn't it recommended?

Turning the control to "off" is easier but does not disconnect power to the appliance. For complete safety in cleaning any appliance powered by electricity it is best to unplug the cord from the outlet.
