Henry Wilcox, director of the Pennsylvania Department's Bureau of Rural Affairs and Marketing Services, was one of the speakers.

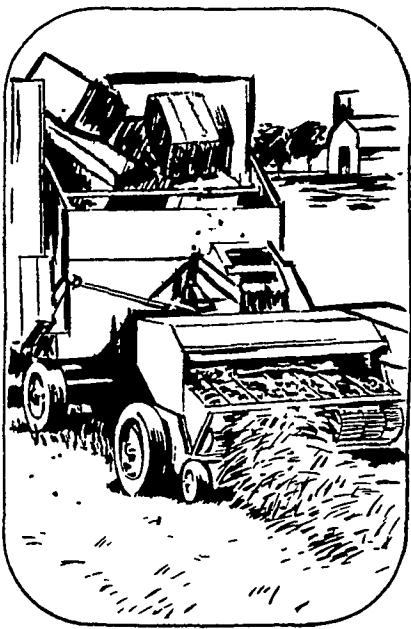
Keynote speaker was Eric Thor of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Farmers Cooperative Service.

4-H Meeting

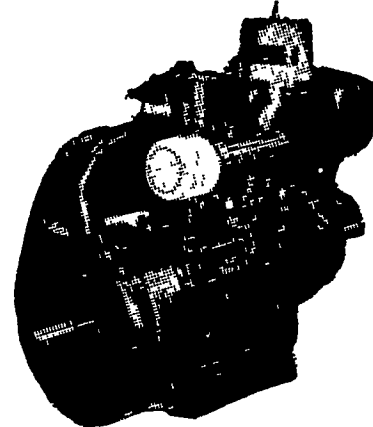
