## Fulton Grange Opposes Proposed Atomic Power Plant

Fulton Grange 66 met in regular session with Grange youth filling officers' chairs and presenting the program.

LeRoy Welk, youth Master, conducted the business session when the Grange went on record in support of a resolution opposing the building of an atomic power plant in the Solanco school district, stating there are already six power plants within a 35 mile radius making it an extremely vulnerable spot in case of a conflict. Also through errors in construction, maintenance or

operation there is the possibility of radiation which would be harmful to residents. There is also the problem of disposing of atomic waste that has not been solved. They also opposed it on the grounds that 600 to 1,000 acres would be removed from taxable property for the Solanco area and during construction there is the likelihood of having many more children to educate thus creating a real financial burden on the district.
