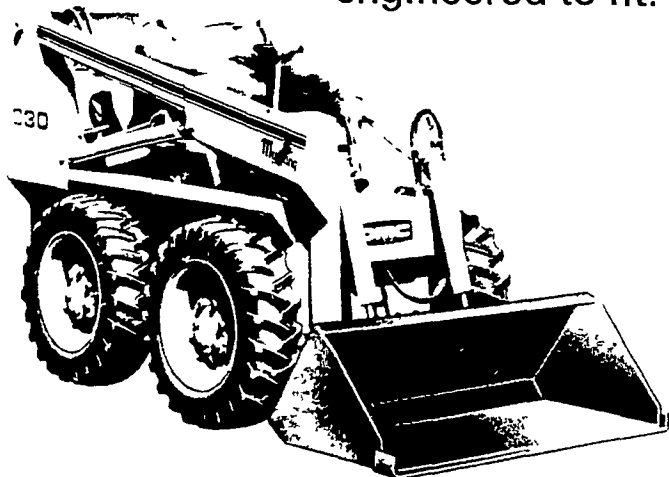
Wednesday, April 12
