There are three entry categories:

- 3 Photo Story (Project Before - Activity and after Improvement)

Entries are limited to five photos in categories 1 and 2; limited to three to five in category 3

Guidelines for photo entries are black and white, size may range from 4x5 to 8x10, no size limit on transparencies or colored prints

Entrants will be competing for prizes in each category. First prize is \$50; second prize, \$25, and third prize, \$10. One person can receive one prize only.

All entires must have the name of the person, address, title of entry, and category listed on the back of each entry, including transparencies

According to Henry Hackman, executive assistant of the Lancaster County Soil and Water Conservation District, the contest is being sponsored to interest students, our future adult citizens, to improve their environment.

Judging will be completed by a panel of three judges, to be announced later. Results of the judging will be announced the week of October 25.
