Ed Van Over, assistant county agent from Sunbury, will chair the afternoon session


Dr Robert F Gentry, poultry disease research, Penn State, will headline discussions at 1:15 p.m on "Methods of Airsac Control." Items to be discussed include: importance and role of ND-IB vaccination; Mycoplasma eradication; Antibiotic egg dipping of chicken and turkey eggs - temperature differential method and vacuum technique, and Pre-incubation heat treatment of chicken eggs technique and field results.






