

McHale, Milk Cooperatives Meet to Discuss Milk Plant

Representatives of seven Pennsylvania milk cooperatives met recently with Secretary of Agriculture Jim McHale at Grove City to discuss the possibility of building a plant to process and bottle their milk near the intersection of Interstate Routes 79 and 80.

Such a plant, McHale told the cooperative leaders, would encourage regulation of milk supply in western Pennsylvania which is plagued with spring surpluses and fall shortages. Western dairymen might also be relieved of price penalties for long distance hauling of milk.

McHale said the Department of Agriculture has funds available for endorsing the study. "I think it's a great step forward just having you fellows sitting around

the table together," McHale commented at the informal breakfast meeting at the Penn Grove Hotel.

The Secretary observed that over the years cooperatives have had trouble getting a fair price for milk because of a lack of a central sales agency to permit effective bargaining with large retail outlets. "I don't expect this kind of thing to come out of today's meeting," McHale said.

"In fact I'm just pleased that we've got you talking together about a common problem."

A feasibility study would be an example of using research funds to upgrade farm income, McHale noted. Previous projects carried on with surplus Fair funds derived from the Harness Racing Commission seem to have benefited special interest groups or duplicated research being

handled most of the department's projects in the past. The cooperatives would contribute marketing information to the University.

Representatives attending the meeting were from Westland Cooperative Farmers, Farmers Union Milk Producers Association, Milk Inc., Country Belle Cooperative Farms, Dairylea Cooperative Inc., United Dairy Farm Cooperative and Eastern Milk Producers.

County Crop-Wheat Loan Rates Announced

County loan and purchase rate schedules for eligible 1972-crop wheat were issued by the U. S.

Department of Agriculture. They are based on a national average loan level of \$1.25 per bushel for wheat, grading No. 1, (the same rate as for 1971) announced July 16, 1971.

The county rates, based on the national average of \$1.25, are generally the same as those in effect for 1971 except in some counties in six states where adjustments are made to reflect historical wheat prices.

The schedule of premiums and discounts for 1972-crop wheat is unchanged from that in effect for the 1971 crop.

Copies of the 1972-crop wheat county and State loan rates as applicable will be sent to States soon. They also will be available from the Grain Division, Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service, U. S. Department of Agriculture, Washington, D. C. 20250.
