Richard J. Ashby Jr., First National Bank of Strasburg Trust Officer, recently participated in a week-long seminar on "Retirement Trusts," according

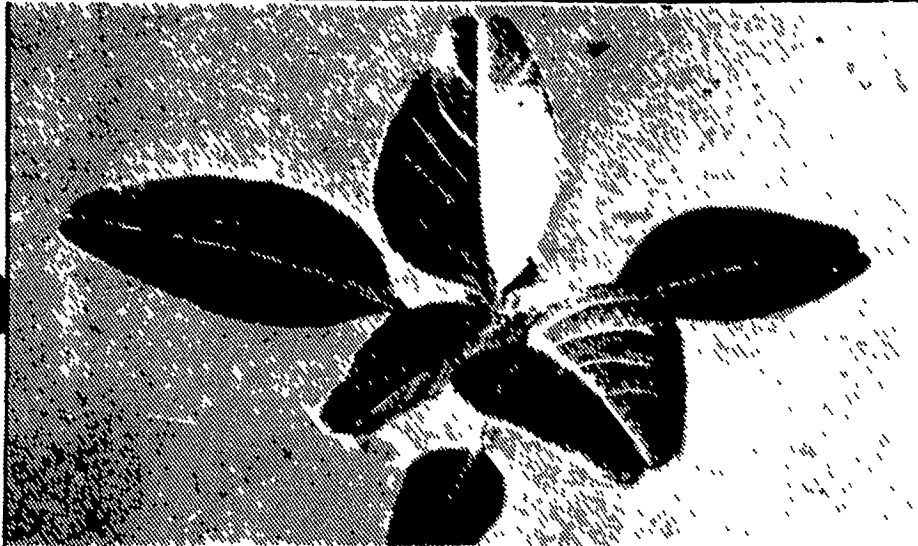
to Donald H. Hoffecker, the Bank's executive vice president. The seminar program covered pension and profit-sharing plans and was conducted in New York
