Slaughter steers approximately 38 per cent, heifers 41 per cent, fairly liberal percentage Choice and moderate volume High-Choice and Prime, cows 9 per cent and feeders 8 per cent. Marketings expanded over previous week but much better distributed over trading period than previous week. Price advance on fed cattle a reflection of higher prices on carcass beef at wholesale level. One major packer out of market with labor difficulties which were settled late in week, but there was a continued broad demand for cattle to be slaughtered at points outside the immediate Omaha area. 
