Advisory Council Names Two Area Men as Officers

Amos H. Funk, Millersville RD1, was elected president of Pennsylvania State University's agricultural advisory council during its semi-annual meeting recently.

Other officers elected to serve two-year terms with Funk were: John L. Walker, Finleyville, vice president; Albert M. Best, New Holland, secretary-treasurer.

Funk represents the Pennsylvania Association of Soil and Water Conservation District Directors, Inc., on the advisory council. Walker represents Milk, Inc., and is director of member

services, Pittsburgh Division Best is manager of Research and Development, Sperry Rand Corporation, New Holland Machine Company, and represents the American Society of Agricultural Engineers (Pennsylvania Section)

The Council, composed of 65 representatives of ag-related Pennsylvania organizations, offers counsel and support for the programs, facilities, and activities of Penn State's College of Agriculture. Administrators and faculty members of the College

meet with the advisory group twice a year.

John Reed Rodgers, Belleville, who has served the Council as president since 1968, and retiring vice president Enos B. Heisey, Hershey, received Penn State hon. statuettes during the meeting for their service to the Council and the University Dr. R. E. Larson, University interim provost, presented the awards.

Both men will continue as Council members. Rodgers represents the Pennsylvania Grassland Council and Heisey represents Agway, Inc.

The meeting concluded with a tour of the new Agricultural Administration Building on the University Park campus.
