should also contain one per cent trace-mineralized salt. The Ca and P supplementation should be based upon forage tests. It is a good idea to provide these three mineral supplements free-choice for added insurance, but not as the only source.

Milk Fact
A cow producing 16,000 pounds

of milk testing 3.5 per cent fat during a 10 month period produces an amount of protein equivalent to the edible cuts of eight 1,200 pound steers or 28 200pound pigs.
