Horsemanship 13 and Under champion, Kristan Jordan; reserve, Kathy Hume.

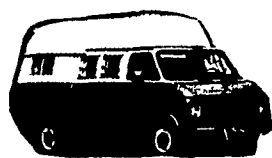

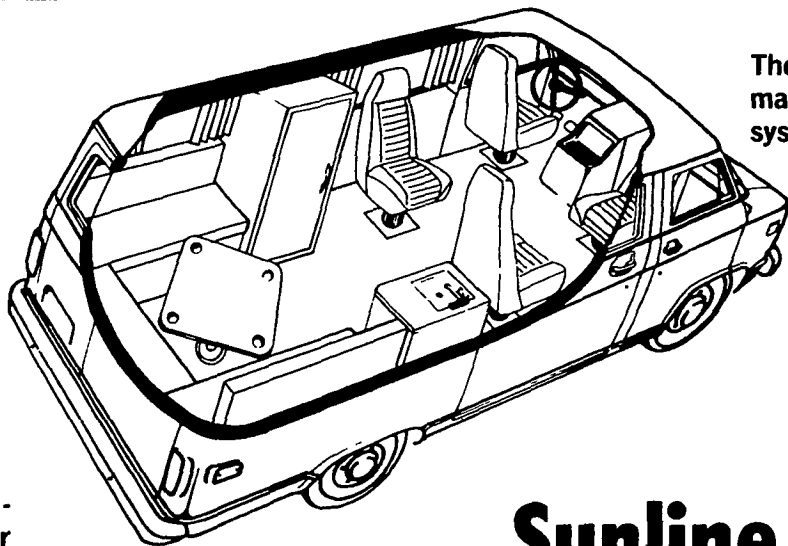
