McLain Named P&SA Administrator

Marvin McLain, former U.S. Assistant Secretary of Agriculture, was named Administrator of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Packers and Stockyards Administration.

Secretary of Agriculture Butz said McLain became administrator May 16. He succeeds Odin Langen, who retired April 1 to resume farming in Minnesota.

McLain has been legislative director of the American Farm Bureau Federation since he resigned as assistant Secretary

of Agriculture in December 1960. He was an assistant Secretary for almost five years, supervising the Agricultural Stabilization, Commodity Credit Corporation and crop insurance activities of the Department.

McLain moved to Washington in 1953, becoming director of the grain division of the Commodity Stabilization Service, a post he held until he was appointed assistant Secretary. He was appointed by President Eisenhower to the National Agricultural Advisory Committee, now the National Agricultural Advisory Commission. He is also a member of Alpha Zeta and Gamma Sigma Delta, national agricultural honorary fraternities.

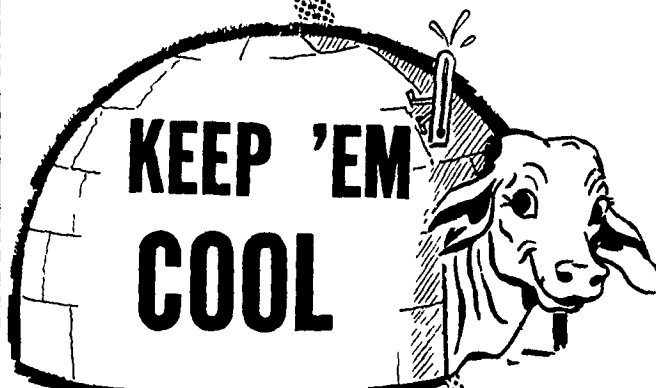
