Redgate Design Milady 5282187 (GP) was bred and owned by August W. Nagel, Rockville, Md. She was transferred in 1961 to King. She qualified as a "super brood cow" on the basis of her lifetime production of 135,999 pounds of milk and 4,804 pounds of butterfat.

This recognition is based on an animal's ability to transmit outstanding milk production and desirable body conformation.

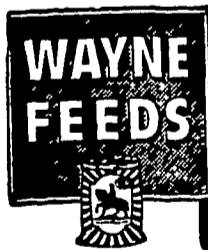

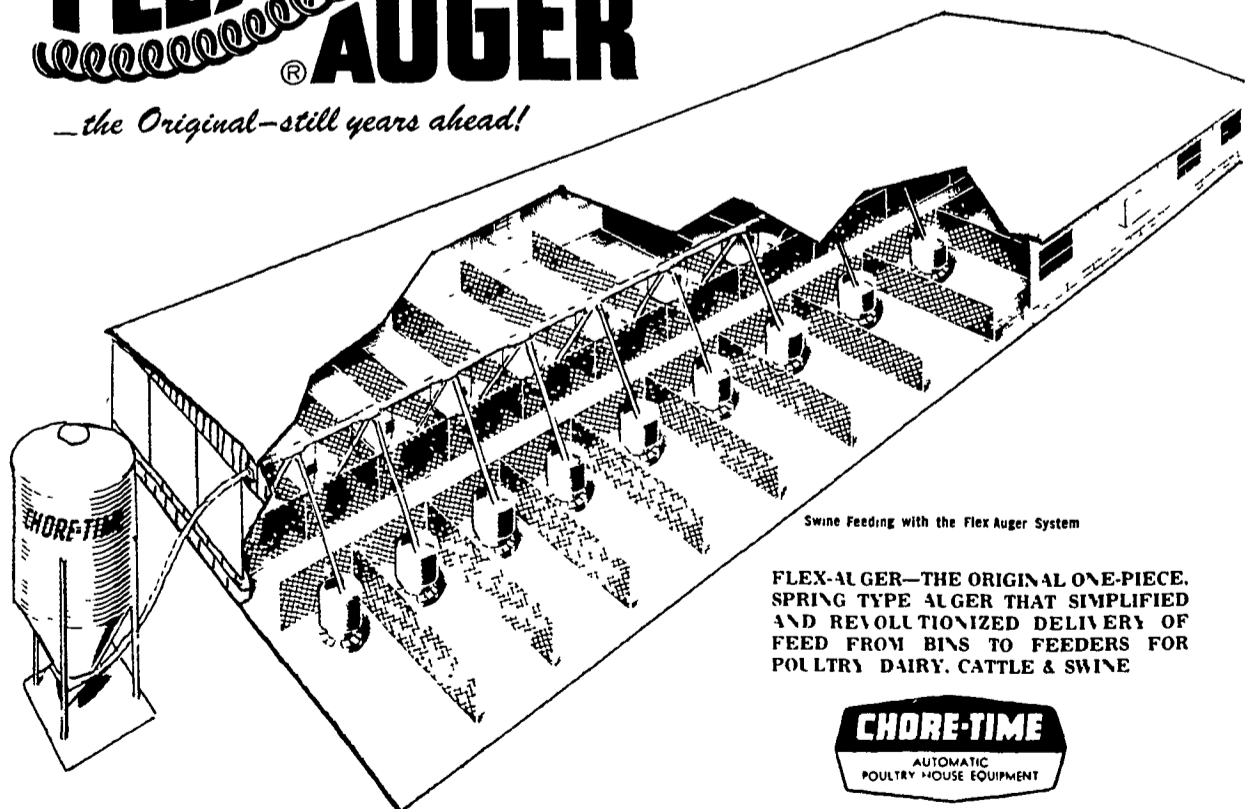
