"A Leadership School for teen leaders, a State Leaders Forum for adult leaders, and Extension Service staff orientation are new aspects of the program." The adult leader attending is Maryann Breneman of Mount Joy.

Selected teen leaders will attend a special school designed to increase skills to work effectively in planning and conducting county youth programs. Topics include communication skills,

understanding social concerns and group processes, and recreation.

Leaders and Extension staff members will meet with College of Agriculture officials and participate in educational workshops involving the understanding of leadership principles, working with groups and communications.
