Meat Consumption Rises in the U.S.

The per capita consumption of red meats (beef, veal, pork, and lamb) reached a record of 192 pounds in 1971, up nearly 40 per cent in 20 years. Nearly all of the net increase resulted from a sharp rise in beef consumption, says H. Louis Moore, Extension agricultural economist at Pennsylvania State University
