

1973 Wheat Program Under Discussion

The National Advisory Committee on Grains — Feed Grain, Wheat and Soybeans — met in Washington Tuesday to discuss the current wheat and feed grain situation and offer ideas and advice for the 1973 wheat program.

Major details of next year's wheat program will be announced as early as possible so winter wheat producers will have time to plan their farming operations for 1973, USDA announced.

Membership of the national advisory committee includes producers and other representatives of the agricultural industry. It meets periodically upon call of the Secretary of Agriculture to advise with USDA personnel on current and background data affecting U.S. grains in connection with the Agricultural Act of 1970.

Farmers Home Insured Notes to be Marketed

Blocks of Farmers Home insured notes totaling about \$300 million will be marketed to the public this month through a nationwide group of security dealers, the U.S. Department of Agriculture announced.

The offering will consist of 600 blocks of promissory notes, each block to have an approximate principal balance of \$500,000 and carry a five-year maturity. An insurance contract covering each block will invoke the full faith and credit of the United States Government to assure repayment of principal and interest to investors.

The rate of interest yield to investors was negotiated between the underwriter group and the Department of Agriculture

this week subject to Department of Treasury approval.

A co-manager group of four security firms led by Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Smith, Inc., will manage sale of the blocks of notes. Other firms of the co-manager group are First Boston Corporation, Salomon Brothers, and A. G. Becker & Co., Inc.

Promissory notes included in the blocks to be marketed will represent loans advanced by the Farmers Home Administration, a USDA rural credit service, for homes, farm properties and community facilities in rural areas of the United States. A total of \$2.45 billion of notes have been marketed in eight issues since block sale through underwriters was introduced in January 1970.


