## Omaha Cattle

Thursday, June 22

Compared with last week's close: Closing price on Average-Good to Prime slaughter steers and all heifers 25-50c lower with High-Choice and Prime 1200-1300 pound steers frequently showing the full decline early. Standard and Low-Good steers steady to 25c lower. Cows generally steady but trading often slow. Bulls steady. Modest feeder supply fully steady.

Four day receipts 18,400 as compared 22,400 previous week and 20,500 a year ago. For first time in ten weeks, closing prices on slaughter steers and heifers lower than at the end of the previous week. Declines triggered by sharp early down turn on carcass beef at the wholesale level and not enough volume late to reflect the reversal of the carcass trade as prices surged upward. Local supplies quite poorly distributed over trading period. While all buying interests sought to bring live prices into an acceptable ratio with carcass realizations, there was a generally good demand as most buying interests were in need of cattle for immediate slaughter requirements. Slaughter steers made up approximately 50 per cent, heifers 31 per cent with a large number Good to Average-Choice, cows 8 per cent, feeders 9 per cent.
