USDA Extends Deadline for Comments on Dairy Proposal

The time limit for comments on a proposal to revise dairy inspection and grading regulations has been extended from 30 to 90 days, the U.S. Department of Agriculture announced today.

The proposal, published in the June 8, 1972, Federal Register, provided for interested parties to submit comments by July 10, 1972. Requests to provide additional time for comments have been granted and the new deadline is Sept. 6, 1972.

The proposed changes in the voluntary dairy inspection and grading program would limit appeals for reinspection or regrading of products contaminated by filth or other harmful substances. Under the inspection and grading program, any interested party who

disagrees with the original inspection or grading of a product may appeal the findings. The proposal would limit appeal on contaminated products to a review of the sampling procedures and a reinspection of the original official sample. This limitation was proposed because such substances are not evenly distributed throughout a product. Thus, reinspection using a different sample, as may be done in other appeals, might in this case result in inaccurate findings.

Comments may be sent in duplicate to the Hearing Clerk, U.S. Department of Agriculture, Room 112, Administration Building, Washington, D.C. 20250 by Sept. 6, 1972. As before, all comments will be available for public inspection.

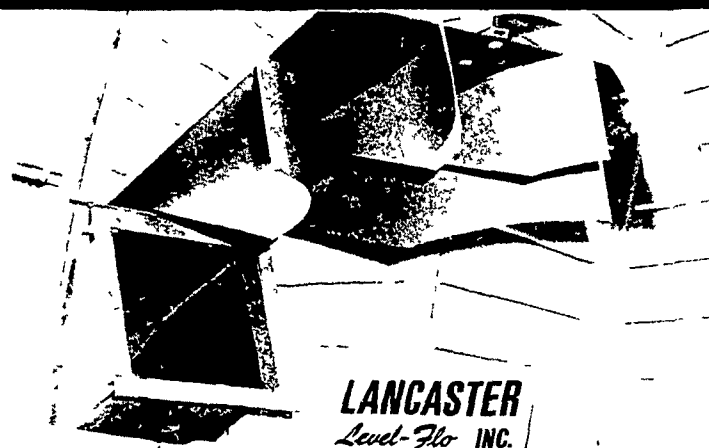
