### In the Kitchen

#### NEVER-FAIL MAYONNAISE

1/2 tsp. sugar  
1/2 tsp. dry mustard  
1/4 tsp salt  
Pinch of red pepper  
1 egg white  
1 cup corn oil  
4 1/2 tps. vinegar

Combine sugar, mustard, salt and pepper in bowl. Add egg white; beat well with rotary beater. Continue beating and add corn oil, a little at a time, until 1/2-cup is used. Add 2 teaspoons vinegar, continue beating, adding remaining corn oil a little at a time. Beat in last 2 1/2 teaspoons vinegar. Store in covered jar in refrigerator. Makes about 1 1/4 cups.
