Farmers' realized net income will reach a new high of \$18 billion or more in 1972, up about \$2 billion over last year, the United States Department of Agriculture announced in its July Farm Income Situation.

"We are pleased that farmers are showing this progress. It will help bring the average disposable income of farm people up to 80 percent of the average of nonfarm people This, too, will be a new record, and compares with 73 percent 5 years ago and 62

"Farmers' net income will be aided further by a slowing down of the rise in farm costs as a result of Government efforts to cool off inflation," Butz added.


