The Penn Willows Club held its Roundup for Sewing and Cooking

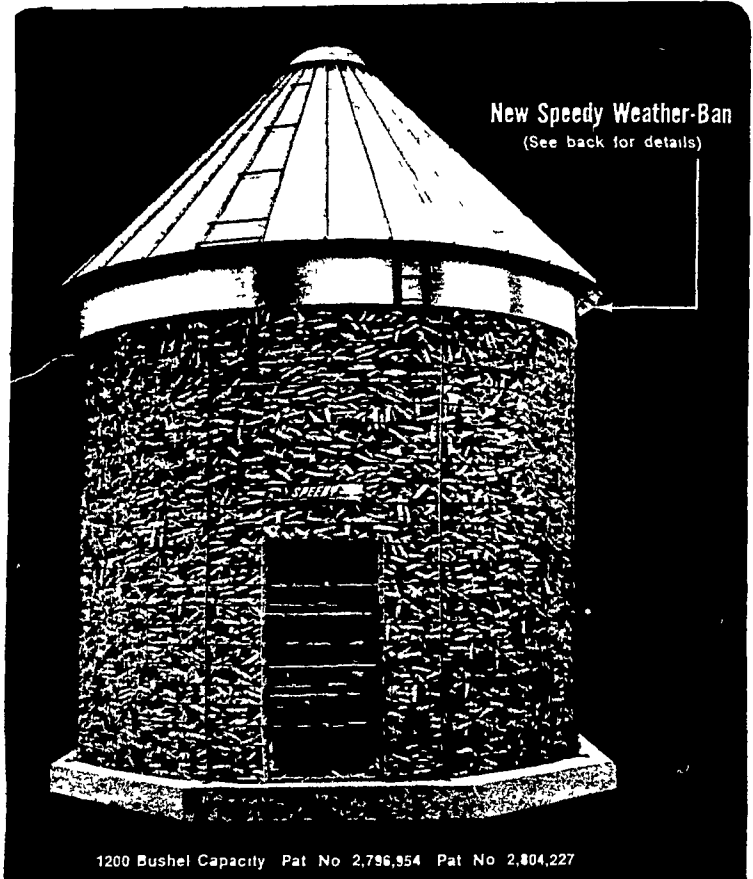
projects recently, including a covered dish supper held at Safe Harbor.
