FMBAS accountants still have flood damage forms for any who suffered loss. The accountants report they have forms for any member and will assist participating members in filing reports.


Broiler Placements Continue Downward

Placement of broiler chicks in Pennsylvania during the week ending August 5 continued to decline at 1,110,000 according to a report this week from the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service.

The placements were 16 percent below the same week a year earlier, and one percent below the previous week. Average placements during the past ten weeks were seven percent below a year earlier.

Settings for broiler chicks were three precent below the previous week at 1,763,000; and twelve percent below the comparable period a year earlier.

Outshipments during the past ten weeks averaged 269,000, twelve percent above a year earlier. Inshipments averaged 40,000 during the same period.


