4 cups fresh strawberries
½ cup granulated sugar
1 cup champagne
1 cup heavy whipped cream
¼ cup slivered, blanched toasted almonds

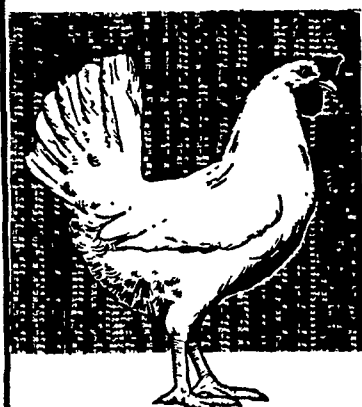
