

Thursday, September 14 Compared previous week's close: slaughter steers and heifers mostly steady after mild early advance erased on later session. Cows 50-75c higher and bulls fully steady. Feeder cattle strong to 50c higher, supply mainly fleshy two-way steers.

Four day receipts 17,000 as compared 13,400 for three day period previous week and 21,400 year ago.
