left, won the Guernsey calf, Don Weaver, center, won the Ayrshire, and Scott Steffy went home with the Holstein.

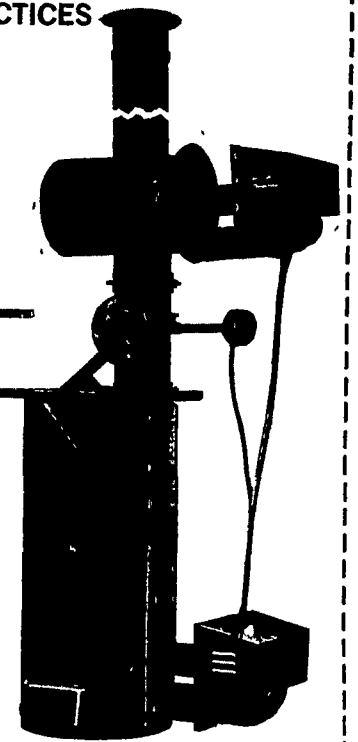
