Riding a Bike Better

Riding a bike is fun, but it can also be dangerous. Smart riders avoid accidents by obeying the rules and by keeping their bikes in good mechanical condition, says the Cooperative Extension Farm and Home Safety Committee of Pennsylvania State University. Keep your bike under control. Such practices as tricky steering, weaving and racing never pays. Ride on the right side of the street, close to the curb. Move with traffic, and watch for parked cars turning into traffic or car doors opening, the committee urges.

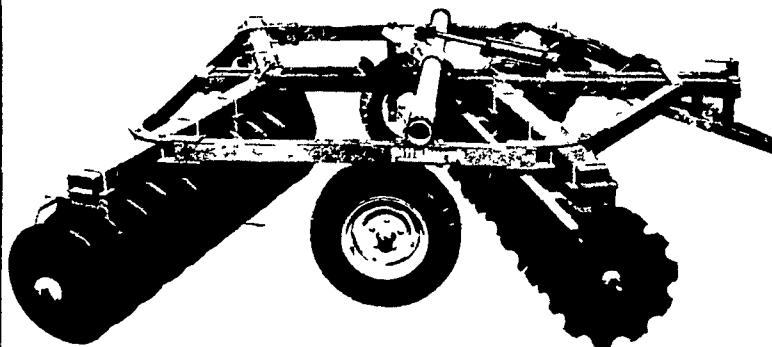
