Members of the Extension staff and faculty of the College of Agriculture will instruct in a wide variety of subjects which are aimed at improving the techniques and skills of milkers. The subjects that will be taught during the three-day school are:

**Wednesday, November 8** - The Dairy Industry Today, Anatomy and Development of the Udder; Visit and Milking Facilities, and Mastitis - the Disease

**Thursday, November 9** - Air Flow and Vacuum, Hormonal Control of Lactation, Equipment Maintenance, Hormonal Control of Let Down; and visit milking facilities

**Friday, November 10** - The Man and Milking Machine, Cow psychology, Cleaning Principles, and Summary and Questions

Pre-registration for this course is necessary, and anyone interested in attending is urged to register by Nov 1
