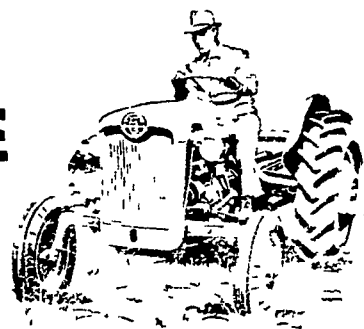

COCONUT CUSTARD DESSERT

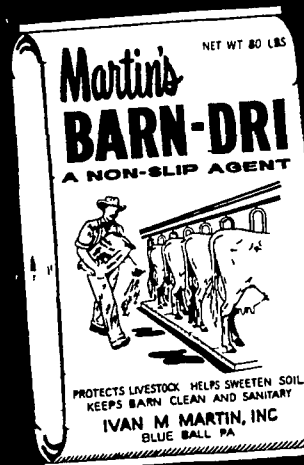
Frozen pound cake (12 oz.)

1/2 cup flaked coconut
6 eggs, well-beaten

1/2 cup sugar
2 tsps. Angostura bitters
4 cups Milk (qt.)

Thaw pound cake and cut into 1-inch cubes. Place cake cubes into a well-buttered 2-quart casserole. Sprinkle with coconut. Combine remaining ingredients in a bowl and beat until smooth and well blended. Pour mixture over cake. Bake in a preheated 350-degree oven for 45 to 50 minutes or until richly brown and firm to the touch in the center.
