Red Beet Chocolate Cake

1 cup salad oil
 1 1/2 cups chopped beets
 1 1/2 cups sugar
 3 eggs
 2 squares chocolate, melted
 1 1/4 cups flour
 1 1/2 teaspoons soda
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 1 teaspoon vanilla.

Blend oil and beets in the blender. Cream together with sugar, eggs and chocolate. Add sifted dry ingredients and vanilla. Bake at 350 degrees, 20 to 25 minutes for layers. Stays soft.

Fudge

3/4 cup undiluted evaporated milk
 2 1/4 cups sugar
 1 (12 oz.) pkg. chocolate bits
 1-3 cup white Karo syrup or honey
 2 tablespoons butter or margarine
 1 teaspoon vanilla
 Combine milk and sugar in heavy sauce pan. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, till it boils. Turn heat low. Cook 10 minutes, stirring. Remove from heat, add chocolate, Karo, butter, vanilla at once. Stir until creamy. Pour in buttered pan. Chill in refrigerator for two hours. Cut in squares. Nuts can be added.

Cheese-Crab Souffle

Serves 6
 1/2 lb Old English cheese, cubed

4 slices bread (remove crust), cube
 3 eggs, well beaten
 1/2 pt. half and half cream and milk
 1/4 cup melted butter
 1 can crab meat (drain)
 1 small can mushrooms
 In a two quart casserole layer bread, half of the cheese, mushrooms, crab meat, cheese. Mix milk, eggs and butter. Pour over casserole and place casserole in a pan of water. Bake at 350 degrees one hour. Serve at once.

Italian Tomato Dressing

1/2 cup oil
 1-3 cup cider vinegar
 1 (8 oz.) can tomato sauce
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 2 tablespoons sugar
 1 teaspoon dry mustard
 1 teaspoon paprika
 1/2 teaspoon oregano
 2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce
 1/2 clove garlic, finely chopped
 2 teaspoons finely chopped onion
 1 tablespoon finely chopped celery
 2 tablespoons salad dressing
 Blend for 15 seconds on high or beat in mixer

Ayrshires Complete Official Records

Official records completed by local Registered Ayrshires were announced recently by the Ayrshire Breeders' Association. Brandon, Vt.

In the Masonic Homes Farms herd, managed by James Horton Elizabethtown, a senior-four year-old named Masonic Homes Lo Betsy completed an official milk production record of 18,690 pounds of milk, 849 pounds of butterfat on twice-daily milking for 305 days. Betsy's record is 1 1/4 times the national average for all dairy cows.

A six-year-old in Charles H Gable's Conebella Farm herd Elverson, Conebella Wheel's Girl completed an official milk production record of 14,200 pounds of milk, 617 pounds of butterfat in 305 days. Girl's record is 1 1/4 times the national average for all dairy cows.
