Four day receipts 20,200 as compared 19,900 previous week and 19,500 a year ago. Slaughter steers approximately 41 percent, heifers 40 percent, liberal percentage Choice and moderate volume High-Choice and Prime but many cattle still carried considerable amount of mud. Fed cattle trade followed uneven pattern with wide day-to-day price vari-actions. Sharp upward surge continued through midweek with Monday price advance the sharpest one day upturn in several years but part of this early upturn lost in late trading as carcass prices pointed downward. The fresh price advance pushed mid-week prices to the highest level since the July summit when steers peaked at 40.35. Most slaughterers came into week with minimum inventories and in need of cattle to meet immediate requirements. The aggressive early demand somewhat minimized the problem of muddy cattle and price discrimination against strong weight steers but frequent complaints were heard on grubby cattle. Cows made up 8 percent

and feeders 7 percent. 
