

Mrs. John Hess Elected to State Farm Women Office

Mrs. John N. Hess, Columbia RD2 (near Mountville) was elected second vice-president of the Pennsylvania Society of Farm Women at the 54th annual convention held in the Farm Show Building Tuesday.

Mrs. Hess is a past president of the Society of Farm Women of Lancaster County and local Society 18. She has served on the State Farm Women board and on the membership committee at the State level. She was head usher for the past two State Conventions.

She is active in the choir and other phases of church work. She has spoken to numerous womens groups and demonstrated egg decorating, dried arrangements and Christmas ideas. She has conducted workshops for Girl Scouts and Future Homemakers of America groups.

Mr. Hess is a farmer and Mountville boro superintendent. Mrs. Hess assists with some physical aspects on the farm such as driving tractor and cutting tobacco. They have one son, John, who is a music major at Wesley College in Delaware.

About 330 delegates represented the 180 state societies including 4,017 members throughout Pennsylvania. This group adopted eight resolutions dealing with ecology, pornography, welfare, drugs, highway safety, assessment of

farm land, women prisoners and bail in morals cases. Copies of these will be sent to legislators of Pennsylvania and the Federal government asking them to consider the recommendations of the Pennsylvania Farm Women when they are representing rural citizens.

More than 1,000 Farm Women including about 150 from Lancaster County attended the Monday session. The theme was a "Do It Yourself" entertainment in which skits, humorous and serious, were presented along with musical programs, satires, and demonstrations utilizing home talents.

Lancaster County presented "Parade for Safety" pointing out hazards around the home and farm. Mrs. Aaron Denlinger received a certificate for 100 percent participation in the Safety program.

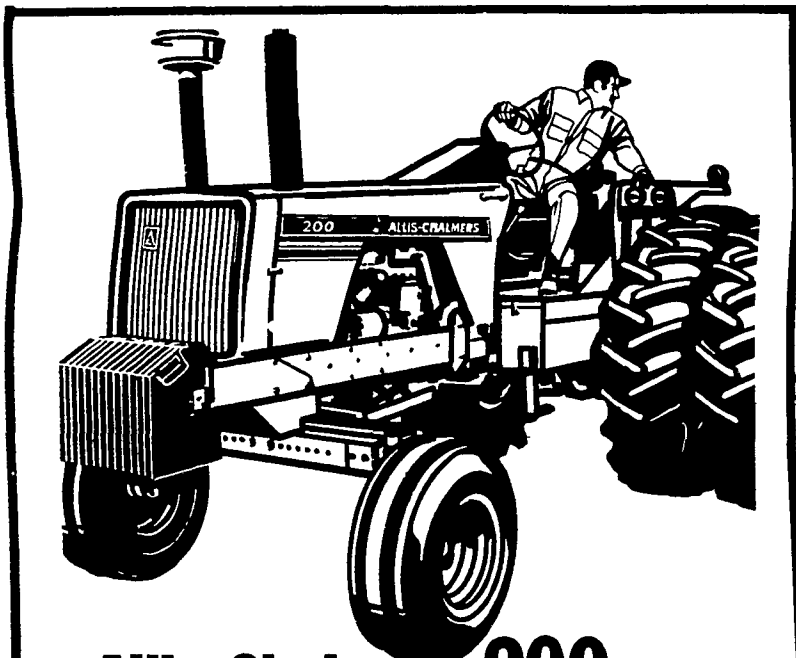
