Homemakers Slate Seminar

Mrs. Larry Hershey, Atglen, RD1 and Mrs. Robert Smiley, Chester Springs, RD1, have been serving as representatives of Chester County on the Planning Committee for the second Southeast Pennsylvania Homemaker's Seminar, sponsored by Extension Service of Pennsylvania State University. The Seminar will involve women from the 13 southeast counties. The Seminar is scheduled for April 3-4 at the Hilton Inn, Lancaster. The theme of the Seminar is "The Challenges of Being a Woman—Make the Most of It."

One speaker selected to participate in the Seminar is Dr. Joyce Brothers, well known NBC Radio Network personality featured on two programs entitled "Emphasis" and "Monitor." Also featured will be Dr. Charles D. Spotts, Lancaster educator and clergyman who has been named theologian in residence at the American Church in Paris, France.

In addition, workshop sessions for smaller groups will be held on social awareness to aid homemakers and other community leaders in dealing with the rapidly changing social conditions in our present day society. Two experienced leaders, Mrs. Miriam Fountain

and Dr. William Bagwell from Cheyney State College's Community Services Center, will be on hand to lead these sessions, titled "Social Awareness—You and the Larger Community". The emphasis in these sessions will be to aid participants to become more aware of, more sensitive to, and better able to deal with cultural, racial, ethnic, and other human relations problems which they face in their daily lives.

Other workshops to be held during the Seminar will include, "Woman and The Law"; "Changing View and the Changing Life"; "Lady Beware"; "Metric System"; "Giving Your Child a Head Start"; "Spiritual Aspects of Being a Woman"; "Stress and Tension"; "Food Information and Misinformation".

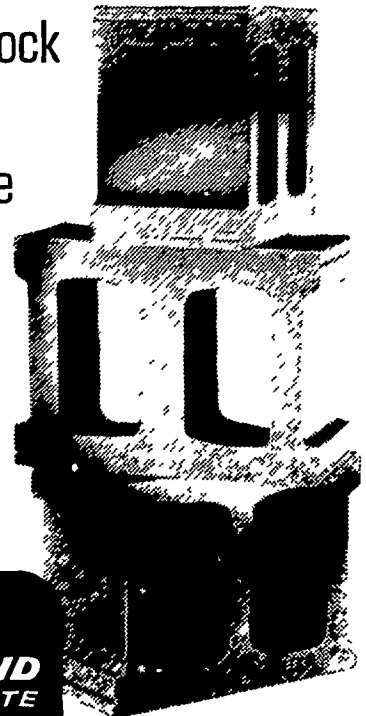
