The secretary said the decision to reduce the maximum temperature of milk in transport from 50 degrees F. to 45 degrees F. was the result of hearings held in the fall.

To enforce the requirement, said McHale, retail delivery trucks purchased after March 1 must be equipped to maintain the lower temperature. By March 1, 1974 all trucks delivering milk must meet the new temperature requirement.

G. William Fouse, chief of the department's Milk Sanitation Division, explained that the lower temperature regulation is in accord with federal regulations.

Fouse added that Pennsylvania regulations had required milk to be maintained in storage - including stores for resale - at the 45 degrees temperature. Since it was hard to reduce the temperature from 50 degrees to 45 degrees in the store refrigeration units, it was decided that trucks should also be made to transport milk at 45 degrees


