He will also speak on the "Federal Flammable Fabrics Act," care labeling regulations, and the new Consumer Product Safety Act.



Fix-It Tip


A file is a tool one uses to keep all other tools in shape, yet in practice, it probably is the most neglected. Files are used to keep saws, drill bits and garden tools in
