Lower Leaf Tobacco Stocks Reported

Stocks of leaf tobacco in the United States and in Puerto Rico totaled 4.7 billion pounds (farmsales-weight) as of January 1, the US Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced recently. The total, based on quarterly reports of dealers and manufacturers, was 128 million pounds less than a year ago.

Domestic flue-cured and burley stocks were below the Jan. 1, 1972 totals by 185 million and 14 million pounds respectively, while the combined inventory of foreign grown flue-cured and burley tobaccos rose 29 million pounds to a record high of 48 million pounds. Foreign cigar leaf tobacco stocks showed a gain of 23 million pounds Domestic cigar filler and dark tobacco stocks reached record lows after decreasing 21 million and 5 million pounds respectively.

Stocks of leaf tobacco under Government loan as of January 1 totaled about 805.1 million pounds, a drop of 344 million pounds from a year ago. These loan stocks were divided as follows: flue-cured, 494.5 million pounds; burley, 293.6 million;

fire-cured, 0.7 million; dark aircured, 13.1 million; and cigar leaf, 2.9 million.

USDA's Quarterly Stocks Report containing detailed tobacco stocks information was scheduled to be published on February 20. Copies may be obtained from the Tobacco Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, Washington, D C. 20250.
