

## Compact Freezers Added to Line

Westinghouse Electric Corporation's major appliance group has added three compact chest models to its freezer line.

The three models and features are:

—Model FCO53 has a 5.3-cubic-foot capacity which can store 186 pounds of food. The unit is 35 inches high, 25 inches wide and 21 inches deep. It has a vinyl wood-grain top and adjustable thermostat.

—Model FCO83 can store up to 291 pounds in its 8.3-cubic-foot area. It also has a vinyl wood-grain top and is available in avocado, goldtone and white.

—Model FCO88, also an 8.3-cubic-foot model, is available in color including an overall vinyl wood-grain finish. It has a lift-out basket, an exterior safety signal light and flexible lid.

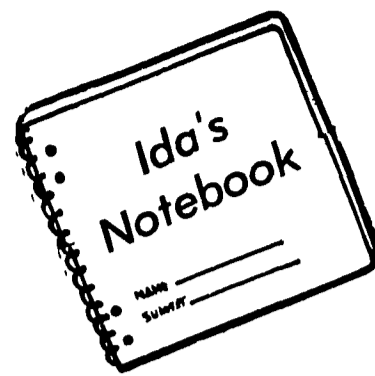
