## Frey Cow Achieves "Iron Grandma" Status

Fultonway Ivanhoe Rae 4977152, EX-90, a registered Holstein owned by J. Mowery Frey and Son, Lancaster, recently completed her sixth consecutive record over 1,000 pounds of butterfat. Her records were made in 365-day or less lactations, twice daily milking.

This record puts "Rae" in a select group of 553 "Iron Grandmas", which are Registered Holstein cows that have produced over 200,000 pounds of milk during their lifetime. "Rae's" lifetime total is 222,053 pounds of milk.

"Rae" also has the two highest consecutive butterfat records produced by a living Holstein cow and two consecutive records over 30,000 pounds of milk. She has recently freshened with a heifer sired by Paclamar Bootmaker. "Rae's" six 1,000-pound records are:

4-3 2x 305 days 25,560 M, 4.5 percent, 1,138 F 365 days 28,530 M, 4.5 percent, 1,290 F; 5-6 2x 305 days 27,741 M, 4.4 percent, 1,221 F, 365 days 30,863 M, 4.5 percent, 1,388 F, 7-2 2x 305 days 29,946 M, 4.8 percent, 1,425 F, 365 days 33,693 M, 4.8 percent, 1,615 F; 8-10 2x 365 days 23,271 M, 4.9 percent, 1,143 F; 10-5 2x 365 days 22,386 M,

4.8 percent, 1,078 F; 12-4 2x 362 days 23,870 M, 4.5 percent, 1,084 F.

Only 13 Holstein cows have produced six records over 1,000 pounds of fat. Eleven of these cows have six consecutive records and four have produced

seven 1,000 pound fat records. HFAA Performance Records Department superintendent Jack Meyer recently announced that 115 records over 1,000 pounds of butterfat were received at HFAA from mid-December of last year to mid-February, 1973. Eighteen records in excess of 30,000 pounds of milk were also received during that period. All were single lactation records completed on DHIR test.

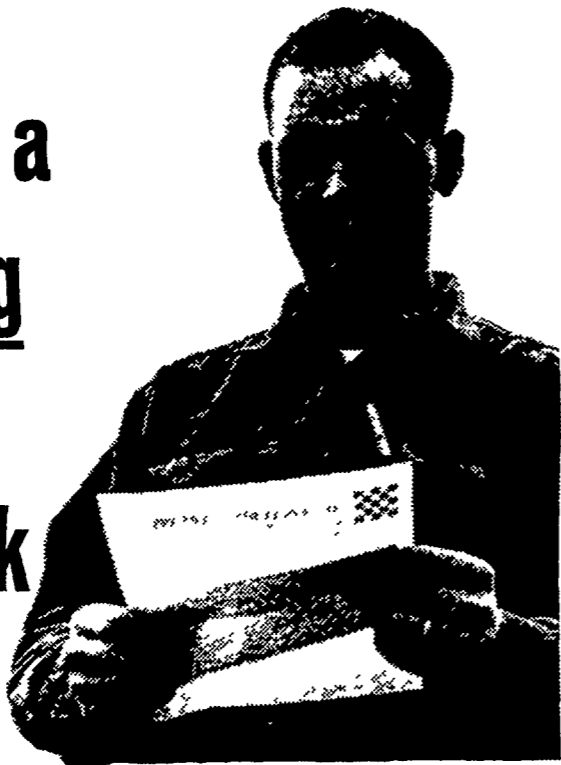

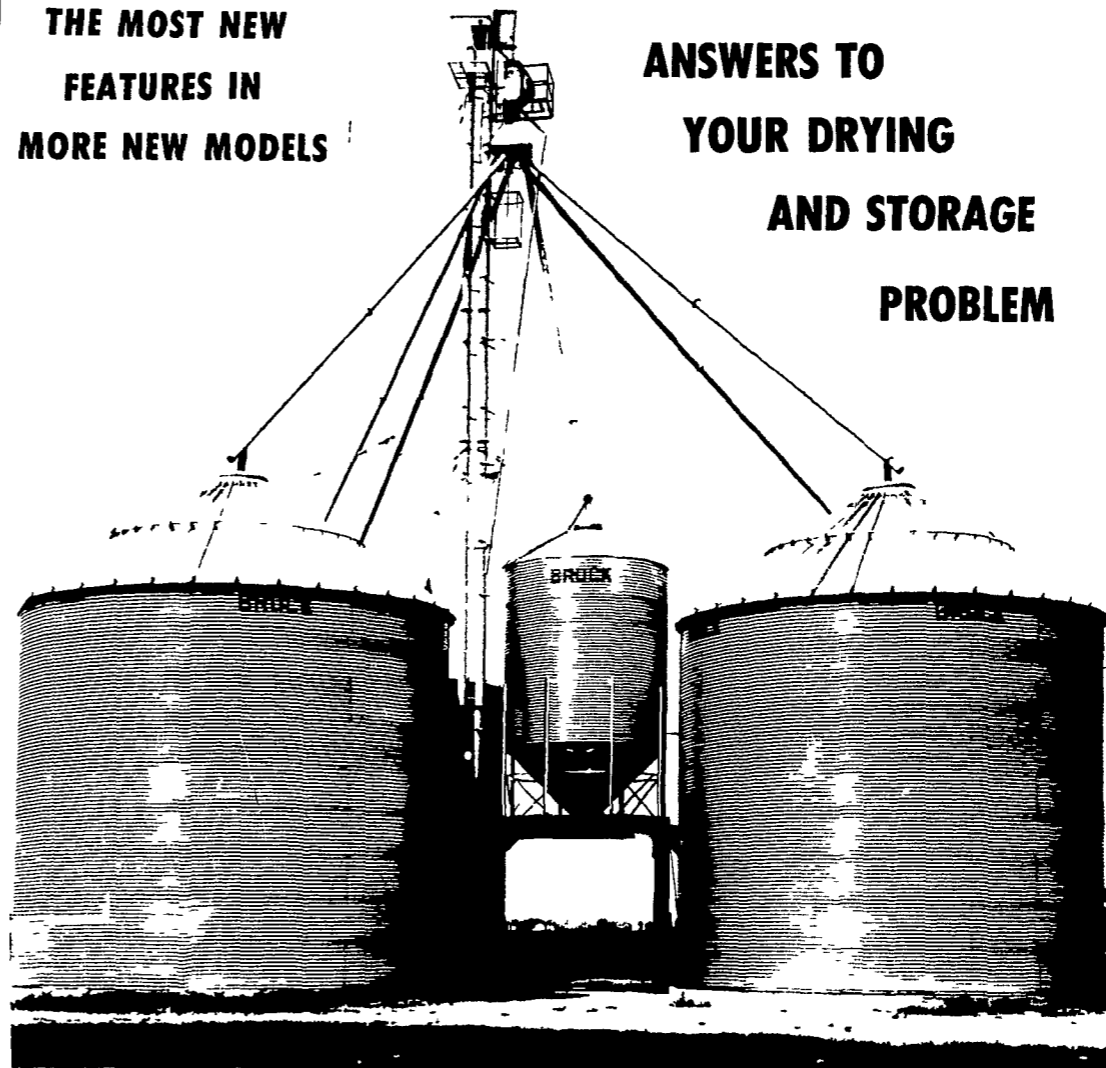
