

Only 13 Holstein cows have produced six records over 1,000 pounds of fat. Eleven of these cows have six consecutive records and four have produced


seven 1,000 pound fat records. **HFAA** Performance Records Department superintendent Jack Meyer recently announced that 115 records over 1,000 pounds of butterfat were received at HFAA from mid-December of last year to mid-February, 1973. Eighteen records in excess of 30,000 pounds of milk were also received during that period. All were single lactation records completed on DHIR test.



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
