Senator Snyder has represented Lancaster County in his State Senate since 1962 and served as County Party Chairman from 1958 to 1964. During his Chairmanship, county voters gave President Nixon a majority of 45,000 votes, the largest ever recorded at that time.

In Harrisburg, Snyder now serves on the Governor's Justice Commission and is Minority Chairman of the Public Health and Welfare Committee in the Senate. In addition, he also serves on the Appropriations Committee, Judiciary Committee and the Rules Committee.
