

Awards Presented at Manor Young Farmer Annual Banquet

The Manor Young Farmer Chapter held its annual banquet recently at the Willow Valley Motor Inn. Toastmaster for the evening was Glenn Mylin.

During awards presentations, two categories were recognized in animal production. Receiving Outstanding Dairyman awards were Jay Clayton Charles, Lancaster RD2, first with 14,525 pounds of milk and 553 pounds of butterfat, and Glenn Burkholder, Washington Boro, second with 13,411 pounds of milk and 505 pounds of fat.

The Outstanding Poultryman recognized was Melvin S. Groff, Washington Boro, with a 2.06-1 feed to weight ratio.

in crop production and management. Areas recognized were corn silage, grain corn and forage management. Awards presented were:

Grain Corn — Larry Harnish, Washington Boro RD1, 222 bushels, first; Richard Neff, Millersville RD1, and Glenn Burkholder, tie for second with 216 bushels; David Hess, 209 bushels, third.

Honorable Mention in the Grain Corn category went to Wilmer Rohrer, Lancaster RD2, with 196 bushels; David McMichael, Lancaster RD6, 193 bushels; Earl Newcomer, Washington Boro

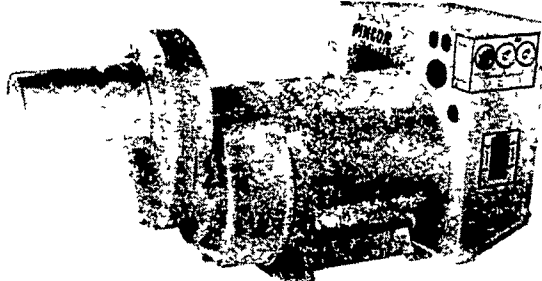
RD1, 191 bushels, and J. Wilmer Eby, Washington Boro RD1, 190 bushels

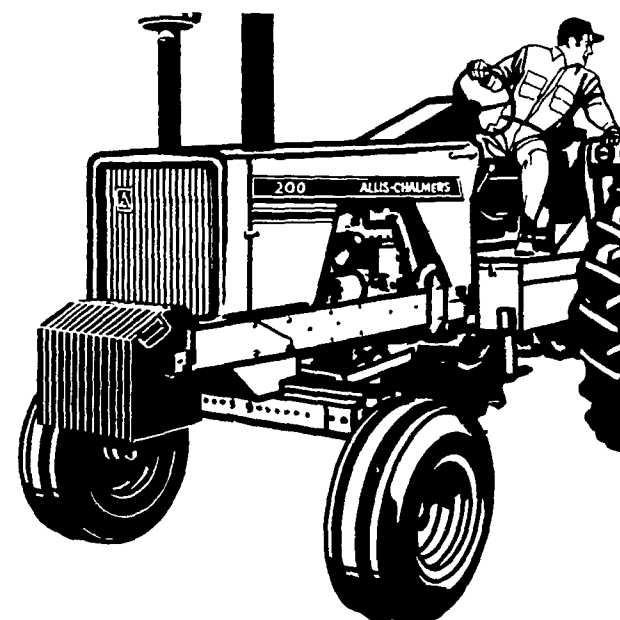

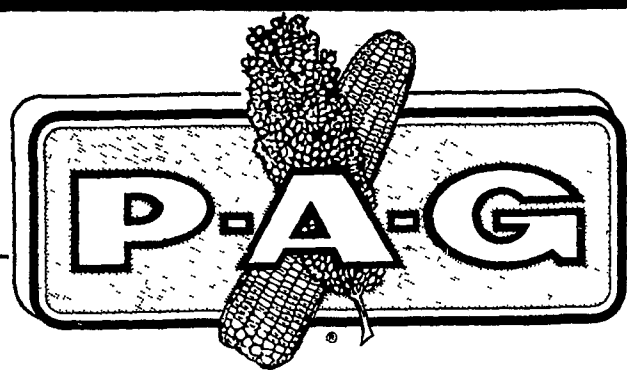
