Energy-Saving Buildings Urged

The United States will have fewer power shortages and less air pollution if its buildings are designed to stop wasting energy, according to Charles E. Peck, construction group vice president of Owens-Corning Fiberglas Corporation.

Foreign Trade Bill Termed 'Unrealistic'

Richard C. Munsche, senior vice president of the Coca-Cola Export Corp., says that the adoption of the proposals in the Burke-Hartke bill for repealing credit for foreign taxes paid would be a "classic case of killing the goose that laid the golden egg."

He points out that an American company may have a profit of \$100,000 on goods sold abroad (and subject to a foreign tax of \$48,000). "Country X," derives a net profit of \$52,000 after the tax. But, if the Burke-Hartke bill became law, he says, the same concern's net profit (after both U.S. and foreign taxes) would be only \$2

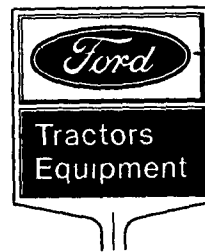

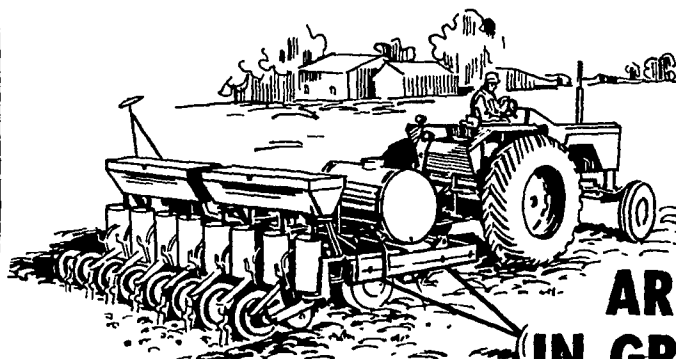
